

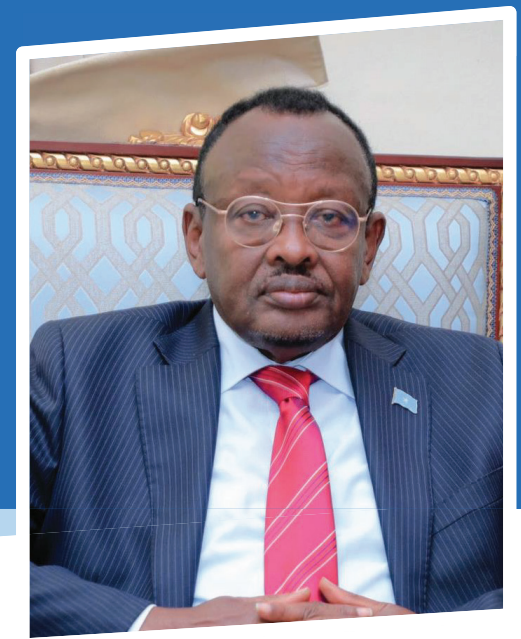

He reaffirmed the ministry's strong commitment to supporting female entrepreneurs in their start-up journeys, pledging continued backing for initiatives that uplift women in business.

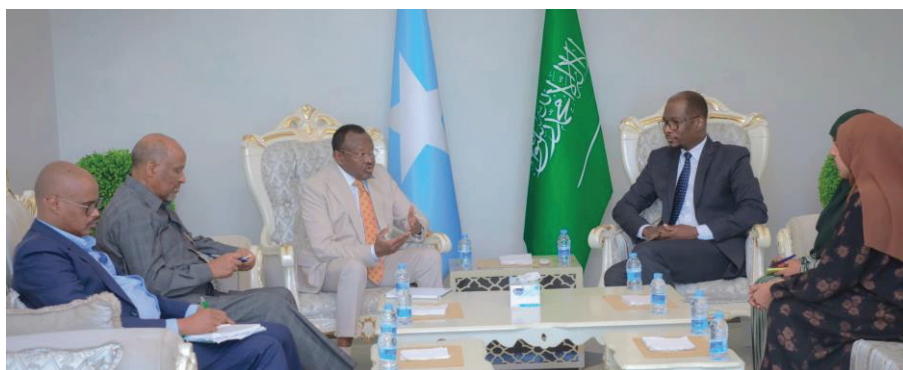

Both parties emphasized the importance of collaborative efforts to drive progress and enhance the quality of life for communities within Khatumo State.



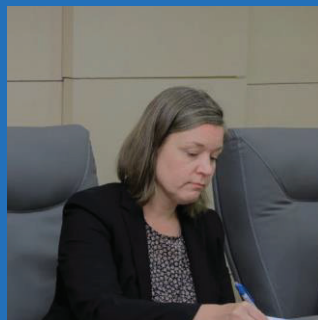


## 09 MINISTRY AND FINLAND COLLABORATE ON FAMILY WELFARE AND HUMAN RIGHTS INITIATIVES

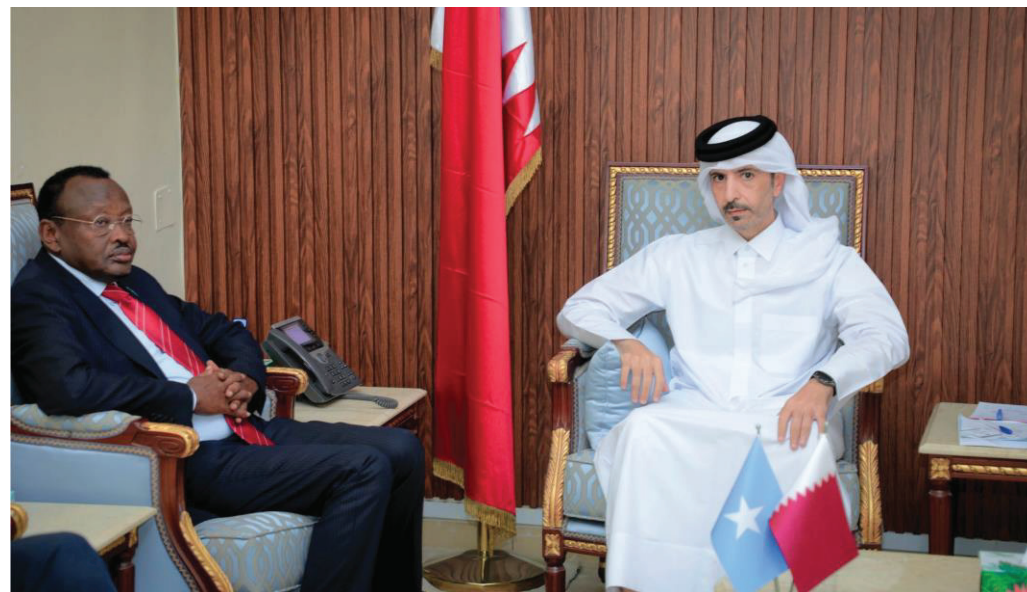


## 18 STRENGTHENED COOPERATION WITH QATAR ON HUMAN RIGHTS AND FAMILY DEVELOPMENT
